Achievements

- MAGOR formally established July 2013. Committee of 7, 200+ supporters and many local businesses
- Active support of -
 - Community, schools, local businesses, MP, AMs, community council, Monmouthshire County Council and Railfuture
- Acknowledged by Network Rail, First Great Western and Arriva TW.
- Station now shown on the city-region metro map.
- Elevated to priority 4 (of 27) for new transport initiatives in MCC, Strategic Transport Plan.





- Magor & Undy Walkway Station: USPs
 - Unique Walk/Cycle To Community Asset
 - Contributing to Reducing Carbon Emissions
 - Contributing to Road Safety
 - · Contributing to Well Being of People



- Benefits
 - Money
 - Financial Benefit Cost Ratio' of 2.06 rising to 3,30 (source Dr Simon Blaney)
 - Save commuters average of £750 PA
- Convenience
 - Integrated multi-modal link-Buses/Walking/Cycling/Cars/Trains
- Time
 Savings for travellers



- Next Major Challenge
 - Raise Match-Funds: GRIP 1 & 2Study
 - Crowdfunding/Monmouthshire Made
 Open Projects.



- Other Compelling Reasons for Magor & Undy Walkway Station
 - Magor and Undy within "Severnside Area" 48% travel out of the area to work
 - Supports 'Active Travel (Wales) Act 4th November 2013', improving facilities and routes for walkers and cyclists
 - Population growing 6500+ with a further 500 houses proposed.
 - Benefit Cost Ratio' of 2.06 rising to 3.30 higher than many new stations.
 - Lydney, Chepstow, Caldicot, Severn Tunnel Junction railway line -126% passenger growth in last 10 years
 - Proposed site located to encourage walking to the site instead of car use.
 - Possible integration with the Community Centre/South East Wales
 Energy Buildings
 - Facilities and ticketing franchising revenue returned to community funds.
 - Eases pressure on Severn Tunnel Junction.



- Potential to capture Newport, Cardiff and Valleys commuters, who currently use cars
- Offers an opportunity for in-coming workers (around 1000)
 e.g. distribution centres, business park and brewery
- Reduces the volume of traffic on the B4245 by an estimated 60,000 vehicle movements per annum.
- Site also has the advantage of direct integration with the half-hourly bus service
- Uses the 'relief lines' to avoid conflict with the mainline
 Inter-City express services and Inter-Urban Class
- At Magor no costly 'track slewing' required
- With ministerial & WG support the target date for completion 2018 is realistic and viable!
